



It may or may not be to early to be thinking about Christmas Poinsettia plants for the church, but this is to inform you of a change this year. Because it is a monumental chore and task keeping these plants alive for the Christmas Season (watering, cleaning dead leaves etc.), the parish council decided that buying silk poinsettia plants might be the way to go - they will last for years and years to come, no watering or cleaning up; however

In the vestibule is one plant that we have already bought. It looks very realistic to the real thing.

The cost is eighty dollars (\$80.00) per plant and we need 31 plants. We are making this available to the parish family. If you would like to donate a plant as a lasting memorial or donation we are also going to have some type of memorial label attached to the plant. Colors are red or white and the same layout of plants will be arranged in the church (Main Altar, St. Mary & St. Joseph, Manger and Vestibule).


If this is something you might be interested in, please contact Fr. Ruda or any parish council member by the middle of November.

CHURCH OFFERING ENVELOPES & ATTENDANCE

It is **no secret** that many **people today** have a far **different view** on **church attendance** and **support** of the **church. So be it.**

This statement is not directed to those who have medical conditions and cannot attend or those who must work on Sundays or those out of town as far as attendance is concerned, but financial support is something else.

The success and unity of any parish has to be the responsibility of the entire parish community, to prayerfully work through this downward spiral in our parish and make church a positive force.

Here is a review of our parish offering envelope format - Current Expenses: Day to day operation expenses, insurance, utilities, salaries etc. Parish Center Expenses: Goes exclusively to pay utilities, insurance plus upkeep of the parish family center. Mission Fund: Helps with the mission work of the National Catholic Church and our mission endeavors on a local level. Green Cemetery Envelope: Helps maintain the parish cemetery. Blue Energy Envelope: Helps with the heat and electric bills for the parish complex.



As a **community project**, we will be **collecting needed supplies** for the **Broome** County Humane Society.

The **list of needed supplies** is available in the vestibule. **Bins** will be placed in the **vestibule October 15** until **Sunday, November 12.**


